Marist's School Psychology Master's Program focuses on instruction in the theories and skills associated with the responsibilities regularly intersecting by a school psychologist: prevention, evaluation, intervention, counseling, and consultation. Our goal is to prepare professionals who manifest a holistic blend of theory and practice in meeting the educational needs of today's students within the interacting contexts of their schools, families, and communities.

- Leads to New York State certification and eligibility to apply for both New York State certification and NCSP national certification.

OUTCOMES

- ▶ 91% of last year's graduates were employed as school psychologist within six months of graduation.

DEVELOP VALUABLE SKILLS AS A GRADUATE ASSISTANT All accepted students are considered for a two-year Graduate Assistantship. Participating students receive a tuition waiver and stipend totaling \$4,500 per year, for a total of \$9,000. Graduate assistants provide support to faculty for research and other responsibilities. Assistants have co-presented research findings with faculty at regional conferences.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- ► Graduate admissions application (available online)
- Bachelor's degree in Psychology or a related field (Human Behavior, Education) with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Completion of undergraduate courses with a preferred GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - ► General Psychology
 - **▶** Statistics
 - Psychological Research Methods
 - ▶ Psychological Testing is recommended, not required
- ▶ Personal statement of at least 500 words answering the question: What is the biggest challenge school psychologists face today?
- ► Resumé
- ▶ Three letters of recommendation from professors who taught you in classes, or supervisors for an internship or job.
- Interviews will be offered to qualified students with the program faculty upon invitation.

APPLICATION DEADLINE – MAY 15*

*Applications received after the deadline will be reviewed on a space-available basis.

PROGRAM FORMAT

Courses are offered at our main campus in Poughkeepsie, New York. First-year courses are three nights per week. Second-year courses are two nights per week, and you will have a part-time, daytime practicum in a school. Your third year is a full-time internship in a school, with one class at night.
