



Russian Civil War 1917-23


- Thirteen Allied nations invade Russia
- USA sends troops to Arkangel and Vladivostok
- Ukraine and Poland form independence movements
- Red Army secures control of the Ukraine
- Poland, Baltic States and Finland break free




Soviets Rebuild After Civil Wars

- New Economic Policy (NEP) complements state-ownership
- Education for all from 3 to 16 a priority
- Diplomacy replaces the most obvious confrontation in Europe




German-Soviet Military Cooperation 1922-33

- Both countries isolated
- Germany rearmament forbidden
- Soviets needed advanced training
- Treaty of Rapallo: Germany and Soviet Union renounce claims upon each other



COMINTERN Finances Revolutions around the World


- Chiang Kai-Shek, Chinese leader

- Union organizing in Britain and elsewhere cause break in relations w/UK






Soviet Famines 1921-33

- Famine 1932-33 worst
- Five-Year Plan incl
 Collectivization
- Stalin ordered mass movements of restive minorities to hinterlands





Nikolai Vavilov World-renowned developer of hybrid crops

"We Have to Become Specialists"

- Huge numbers of peasants were needed in industry; move to cities
- Workers with little formal training grabbed up by competing factories
- Advancement possible for former poor peasants
- Women occupy professional occupations as much as men; but not as supervisors





Moscow Show Trials 1936-38

- Marks the last major purge of military and government officials
- American commentators are generally un-plussed
- Marks the transition from dedicated Communists to bureaucrats



The 1936 Constitution of the Soviet Union



• 1937: Stalin celebrates a "More Pleasant Time"

- More consumer goods
- New Soviet
 Constitution (see stamp at right)
- Improved Living conditions
- Education advances (see next slide)
- However, the threat of war soon diverts consumer funding towards rearmament



Polikarpov I-16


- The world's first low-wing fighter with retractable landing gear to attain operational status
- I-16 spurred advances elsewhere in fighter design
- Figured prominently in:
 - Sino-Japanese War
 - Khalkin-Gol battles between USSR and Japan
 - Winter War with Finland
 - Spanish Civil War






Spanish Civil War 1936-1939

- Nationalists (see on left) aided by Germany & Italy
- Republicans (on the right) aided only by USSR and Mexico
- USA Government was non-interventionist, but volunteers joined Lincoln Brigade



Borders Changed after WWI Continue to Evolve






Khalkhin-Gol Battles - Summer 1939

- Between the Soviet Union, Mongolia, and Japan in what is now Northeast China
- Japan defeated, decided to avoid further conflict with USSR, two years later signing a non-aggression pact on 4/13/1941 a few months before German invasion of the USSR
- Japan, with USSR now neutral, turned towards the Pacific and Southeast Asia, leading to its attack on Pearl Harbor and the broader conflict in the Pacific









Hitler Invades USSR

- Sunday, 22 June 1941
- Three Giant German Armies
- Stalin minimized the importance of multiple intelligence warnings

Battle of Stalingrad

- 23 August 1942 2 February 1943
- One of the three main German Armies headed towards the Caucasus and unsuccessfully fought for control of the city
- The battle was marked by fierce direct assaults on civilians in air raids, sniper activity and other aspects of modern urban warfare



- 42,330 IL-2 were built, making it the most produced military aircraft design in aviation history
- Load-bearing armor plates replaced the frame and paneling throughout the nacelle and middle part of the fuselage
- The armored hull secured the aircraft's engine, cockpit, water and oil radiators, and fuel tanks
- Inspired the design of USA's A-10 used since before the Iraq Wars

Ilyushin IL-2 Sturmovik Tank Destroyer






Anna Alexandrovna Timofeyeva-Yegorova (1916 – 2009)

- She flew a total of 277 sorties before she became a prisoner-of-war when her II-2 was shot down
- Awarded the title of Hero of the Soviet Union and Order of Lenin in 1965

Post-War USSR

- Massive death and destruction imperil USSR survival
- Continuing agriculture crises and poor availability of consumer goods
- Iron Curtain countries form a strategic belt around USSR
- Nuclear research leads to Soviet atomic bomb and nuclear power industry
- Berlin Crisis
- Stalin punishes dissent and chases real and imagined plotters


The Khrushchev Thaw

- Modernization of agriculture and industry
- Collective leadership after Stalin died in 1953
- East Germany repressed by Soviets in 1953
- Hungary repressed by Soviets in 1953
- Space exploits
- Foreign policy upsets rank and file especially after Cuba confrontation



Brezhnev Period of "Stagnation"

- He accomplished many of the reforms begun before his 1964 promotion to leader
- Liberalized many cultural aspects
- Invaded Czechoslovakia in 1968
- Export of petroleum finances consumer goods and lifestyle improvements
- Began the Afghan War in 1979
- Died in 1982
