To start, I wanted to share a little information about myself. I joined the Marist Fashion Program faculty in the Fall of 2018. Prior to that, I worked in the fashion industry in NYC for 17 years. The majority of my career concentrated on buying and planning in the luxury market focusing on women's Ready-to-Wear (apparel). After graduation from college with a degree in fashion merchandising, I started in the executive training program at Saks Fifth Avenue. I spent 5 years at Saks working my way up from assistant buyer to associate buyer to planner. While at Saks, I went to school at night to earn my MBA. After Saks, I joined Valentino as the retail buyer for U.S. stores and was responsible for all product categories. Next, I worked for Giorgio Armani as the buyer for the U.S. stores with a primary focus on women's RTW. From there, I joined the buying department at Tory Burch as the RTW Director of Buying. Most recently, I was the VP of Retail at Derek Lam overseeing all aspects of their retail stores including buying, planning, operations, sales, etc. as well as their e-commerce business and digital marketing.

- There is only one lesson per week, except for Week 1 which has an additional brief introduction lesson.
- There is also a final project that is due at the end of the term on Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup> at 11:59 p.m.
