Welcome to Child Development, PSYC 317-721. The course begins on Monday, June 3rd, 2024 and ends on Friday, July 26th, 2024.

During this summer online asynchronous course, you will be examining the physical, intellectual, and socio-emotional aspects in the development of children from conception through middle childhood. This course is designed to assist students in exploring the various influences that shape children's development. We will be critically considering theories of development, and learning to identify skills and milestones, while applying this knowledge to real-life scenarios.

The course will be delivered online via Brightspace. Please take some time to explore our class site and familiarize yourself with the various resources available to you. When you have access to the online site, please review the syllabus and class schedule. You will watch short pre-recorded lectures for each chapter and read the accompanying sections of the textbook. Each chapter has an associated chapter activity, and each unit has an associated exam review and exam. We have a lot of information to cover, and I pace you through the material. Throughout the course, an assignment or assessment is due every two days. You will have to organize your time effectively in order to watch the lectures and complete the readings with enough time to submit the chapter activities. Chapter activities should be completed before submitting an exam review, and an exam review should be submitted before you take your exam. Paying attention to deadlines will be vital to your success in the course.

The course is divided into 4 units:

- 1. Foundations of Child Development (Theories, Genetics / Prenatal Development, and Birth)
- 2. Infancy and Toddlerhood (the "growing years" between 0-2 years old)
- 3. Early Childhood (the "playing years" between 2-6 years old)
- 4. Middle Childhood (the "school years" between 6-12 years old)

The textbook for this course is listed below. This can be purchased from the Marist bookstore or other online vendors. Please make sure that you have the textbook before class begins so that you are ready to begin your reading on the first day of class.
