 - Using Brightspace and Banner programs for classes
 - International Student Services Office Resources
 - Getting a job on campus
 - Immigration and work authorization
 - Using health insurance – Learn how now, not when you are ill
 - Maximizing your library usage – onsite and online
 - Free access to campus athletic facilities
 - How to use Career Services to help with resumes, cover letters, interviewing, on-campus events to meet employers, and help with job searches
- Online Pre-Orientation is provided before you come to New York. Get your questions about moving and starting class answered. Learn what you need to bring to New York
- Your classes will be on campus as required by your F-1 VISA requirements. One class per semester may be taken online each semester if you are in the MS in Information Systems degree.
